Public Works

Throughout the Spring, Summer and Fall the Public Works Dept. will be out grading, cleaning gutters and drainage pipes along Township owned roadways and easements. We will also be out surveying and collecting an inventory of our storm water pipes and inlets throughout the Township. Residents may see Township employees opening and cleaning manholes, pipes and drainage boxes along the road, within the road right-of-ways and within some drainage easements through their property.

We will also be preparing Stouts School and Steely Hill roads for Fry's Run culvert replacements this summer. The culverts will be done one at a time. Residents should expect extended road closures and detours around that area until both projects are completed.

We will try and post updates on these projects and our annual road project work on the Township website under the public works tab.

Northampton County Housing Rehabilitation Program

The Program may be able to provide low-income owner-occupants of single-family residences with a zero-interest, partially-forgivable, deferred-payment loan for up to \$25,000 in home improvements in some cases. The loan can cover a range of improvements necessary for health, safety, and code compliance requirements. Lead-based paint hazards and electrical risks will be identified and removed from the home, and a full complement of smoke and carbon monoxide detectors will be left in all required locations.

The Program can frequently complete repairs to plumbing, electrical, and heating systems; roof, foundation, and exterior wall repairs; trip and fall hazards; moisture, water, and mold issues; drywall repairs; and some incidental items. Funding is also available for accessibility improvements to owners' homes, and such work may be completed at the direction of a physician or other qualified professional.

Program staff will work closely with loan recipients to develop a scope of needed repairs,

select a general contractor, and manage the construction process and disbursement of payments to the contractor. The Program is administered by the nonprofit Community Action Committee of the Lehigh Valley (CACLV) on behalf of Northampton County, and is funded by U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) Community Development Block Grant funds.

Eligibility Requirements

Homeowners are eligible to apply to the Program if they meet the following requirements, at minimum:

- · Owners must be permanent residents and owner-occupants of their single-family home.
- Owners must be current on all municipal, school district, and Northampton County real estate taxes, as well as all municipal bills.
- Owners must carry homeowners' insurance on their property.
- A title search will be ordered and forwarded to Northampton County DCED. The property must not be overly encumbered to accept the loan, per DCED's assessment.
- Owners must not have received housing rehabilitation assistance through this program, or any other housing rehabilitation program (excluding home weatherization or programs providing accessibility modification) within the past five (5) years.
- Owners' household income must be below eighty percent (80%) of Area Median Income per HUD guidelines.
- Other terms, conditions, and requirements apply. Program staff will review them in detail with applicants.

Frys Run Watershed Association Streamside Tour and Native Plant Sale

FRWA will be holding a streamside tour and native plant sale on September 29 at Frys Run Park on Royal Manor Road and Route 611. We'll be showing the ways the life on the stream affects the life downstream on the Delaware and beyond, and how things influence the wildlife, fish and plants in our neighborhood. There will be a stop on the creek to spotlight history through the ruins of mill dams, and another stop to illustrate the microscopic life that makes all the other life on the stream happen. We'll finish with water testing

so we can see just how clean our stream is.

Native plants will be for sale as a way of bringing in that side of the ecology of the watershed. Plants that provide pollination for the insects are critical for so much of what goes on in life in the watershed, and everywhere.
