## **The Public Works Department**

The Public Works Dept. will continue to survey and collect an inventory of our storm water pipes and inlets throughout the Township. We will also continue to survey the public sewer system throughout the Morgan Hill golf course community. Some residents may see Township employees opening and cleaning manholes, pipes and drainage boxes along the road right-of-way and within some drainage and public sewer easements through their property. Township employee's would not be entering any residents home.

Residents are reminded that Williams Township passed a Bamboo Ordinance 2017-4 that went into effect October 16, 2017. If any resident has Bamboo on their property and it is creating a hazard along the roadways or an adjourning property you may be in violation of this Ordinance. The Township sited over eight residents for the bamboo on their property that was blocking roadways and creating a hazard for vehicles. Residents should familiarize themselves with this Ordinance if they currently have bamboo or are planning on planting bamboo on their property.

With the winter season soon to be here we would like to remind the residents of our Snow Ordinance 2002-7 that requires all vehicles to be parked off the public roadways throughout the Township during a snow storm. It also requires that residents do not push, shovel or throw snow out into the public street.





## Frys Run Watershed Association Streamside Tour and Native Plant Sale

As anyone who attended our stream side tour recently can tell you, we have a lot going on at Frys Run Park. We have started a multi-year project to rid the stream bank of Japanese knot weed, Japanese hops, and other invasive species that are keeping the native plants from thriving. This involves cutting and pulling on a fairly regular schedule. This stage will go on for the rest of this year and into 2019 as well. The next step will be planting natives and keeping on eye

on them to make sure the invasives don't get re-established. We have plenty of volunteer opportunities so contact us if you have any time to help.

We now have four master watershed stewards living in Williams Township! The course requires 40 hours of instruction and 50 hours of volunteer time. Contact them, or us, at frysrun@gmail.com.
